

Mayor and City Council Open Positions

On November 4th, City voters will elect citizens to fill the following open positions:

Mayor (position currently held by Crystal Shoji) - 2 year term

Councilor (position currently held by Stephanie Kramer) - 4 year term

Councilor (position currently held by Jennifer Groth) - 4 year term

Councilor (position currently held by Tom Leahy) - 2 year term

Councilor (position currently held by Brian Bowers) 4 year term

The Mayor and Councilors are volunteers who serve as the governing body for the City of Coos Bay. The City Council works as a collective body to adopt ordinances, resolutions, the annual budget, and to supervise the City Manager. In order to be versed enough to make such decisions, serving on the Council requires countless hours of study into the pressing issues of the City of Cos Bay, as well as attendance at regular meetings, work sessions, and other external meetings where the Councilor/Mayor will represent the City and its interests.

To qualify for one of the positions, a citizen must be at least 18 year old, a registered voter, and have resided within the city limits for at least one year preceding the election. Citizens interested in being a candidate for a position can file for the position at the Coos Bay City Hall located at 500 Central, Coos Bay with the Elections Officer Monday - Friday from 8 a.m. – 5 p.m. until August 26, 2014. Candidates filing by petition are required to file before 5 p.m. August 21, 2014 preceding the election.

Dan McAvoy Accepts Battalion Chief Position



Fire Season Began June 11th

The Coos Forest Protective Association has determined that the danger of fire in Coos and Douglas County has reached the point that necessitates the declaration of fire season. During fire season, no open burning (including burn barrels) will be allowed outside the incorporated city limits of Coos Bay or North Bend. If you live inside the city limits of Coos Bay, burning of yard debris and the use of burn barrels are still allowed during daylight hours. The Fire Department urges residents to use extreme caution by keeping fires small, keeping a method of extinguishment readily on hand, having a responsible adult present, and by not burning in windy conditions. 



Celebrate Independence Day...

The 4th of July seems to be the true launch of summer. It's warm (or warming), the sun is out, and it seems like the official start of summer fun. Barbeques and family activities are popular on this special day. Alcohol can also be a part of the ADULT celebration, so it's important to plan accordingly.

Unfortunately, some revelers don't think about driving while intoxicated at more prevalent times like holiday parties, news years, and other events while not realizing that a few too many beers at the barbeque can lead to dangerous and unlawful driving.



While certain actions can impact the speed of alcohol absorption into the blood and certainly the amount of time/quantity between consumption can impact your blood alcohol level, it is easy to lose track and go beyond a safe and lawful level.

Unless you're at home and are not planning on going anywhere or you're staying at your friend/family's home, then plan to a designated driver at the barbeque - someone who vows not to just "watch their alcohol" but won't drink any alcohol.

Celebration tips:

If using fireworks (only in lawfully allowed locations), be sure not to mix them with



alcohol. There's no question that your judgment is impacted when your blood alcohol goes up and combining things filled with gunpowder and other explosive quantities can put you and others in extreme risk.

When you arrive at the party and you plan to drink alcohol, give up your keys right from the beginning and deliver them to the responsible non-drinking, designated driver.

Oregon law bans fireworks that fly, explode, or move across the ground more than 6 feet or up in the air more than 12 inches. Fireworks purchased by mail order or in the state of Washington or on Native American reservations may also be illegal in Oregon. This includes popular items such as bottle rockets, Roman candles, firecrackers, and M80s. To keep it legal, purchase all fireworks at a licensed Oregon firework stand or retail outlet.
