

Dear Members of the City of Coos Bay City Council,

Pembina has not met the requirements in order to be issued a permit by the City of Coos Bay. The proposed dredging does not comply with the Coos Bay Estuary Management Plan, City of Coos Bay Comprehensive Plan, and Statewide Planning Goal 16 Estuarine Resources. The Lane Council of Governments provided a thorough analysis with a recommendation to deny the application yet the Planning Commission approved forwarding the application for council review.

Specifically, I am concerned about the following impacts:

- ① Environment - Flora and Fauna, some endangered/threatened are at the mercy of the dredges. This will adversely affect fishing, crabbing, clamming, oyster beds, tourism. The bed is sand/rock.
- ② Constitutional - A foreign entity being given eminent domain over American residents (natives) for no local benefit to those affected is UNCONSTITUTIONAL.
- ③ Geological - We are near the ^{CASCADIA} subduction zone and you are could generate a tsunami that would destroy the facility & endanger residents.
- ④ Peace of mind - Noise, odors, escaped gas (toxic) and the unveiled rift - such a project would affect will adversely affect the lifestyle we enjoy here on the coast.
- ⑤ Pump/dump - The company could build out → raise stock price → leave and we are stuck with the mess.
- ⑥ Eminent - How many times must we say NO before you listen - We vote & we'll be watching you.
- ⑦ No Market - The intended Asian buyers of the gas have other, cheaper sources - it's not economically feasible/profitable so why do it.
