

Public Comment on the Jordan Cove Energy Project (Land Use Application #187-18-000153)

Dear Members of the City of Coos Bay City Council,

Pembina has not met the requirements in order to be issued a permit by the City of Coos Bay. The proposed dredging does not comply with the Coos Bay Estuary Management Plan, City of Coos Bay Comprehensive Plan, and Statewide Planning Goal 16 Estuarine Resources. The Lane Council of Governments provided a thorough analysis with a recommendation to deny the application yet the Planning Commission approved forwarding the application for council review.

Specifically, I am concerned about the following impacts:

Harm to the natural ecosystem, local economy, and recreational uses.

LNG traffic will limit access to in bay crabbing, fishing, kayaking, commercial clam harvest etc. Hurt tourism.

Dredging will impact estuarine species, habitats, biological productivity and water quality. There is insufficient ^{information about} techniques that will be used for dredging.

ODEQ denied the 401- water quality permit in May because the dredging will exceed water turbidity level standards. Applicant could reapply but until they do, City of CB should not make a decision on this permit.
