Ms. Johnson,

I am a North Bend resident who works in Coos Bay and I live in the "vaporization" zone for the proposed LNG pipeline.

I hope that you do not approve any land uses for this pipeline, and I consider, instead, that you petition our US representative, Rep DiFazio, for more port/dredging funds if you think that this in any way addresses needed funding for any of our port activities.

There is a reason that after Coos County bonded to bring in natural gas, it didn't take here in Coos Bay/North Bend. What little natural gas we have today is subject to regular leaks. The LNG pipeline will be much larger in diameter, require much more pressure, and be more fragile as a rigid structure than home or small commercial installations.

Perhaps you would consider contacting the City Commissioner from Humbolt or some other coastal community who've said no to LNG pipelines in their populated areas.
