<u>ISSUE:</u> South Empire Boulevard Multi-Modal Project – Grant Acceptance

BACKGROUND:

The City has received notice of award of grant funding for the second phase of the Empire Boulevard Multi-Modal project (Fulton Avenue to Wisconsin Avenue). The purpose of the two-phased project is to increase pedestrian and bicyclist safety through the widening and overlay of South Empire Blvd from Newmark Avenue to Wisconsin Avenue; the installation of bicycle lanes, sidewalks, and lighting on both sides of the street; the installation of some view points; the construction of a covered shelter/CCAT bus stop; and the creation of some on-street parking along Empire Boulevard.

For phase 2, the City of Coos Bay applied for and was awarded an Oregon Department of Transportation TE-OBPAC Joint Solicitation grant. This project was one of four projects selected for the Transportation Alternatives Program statewide. The grant award is for a total of \$1,387,200. The City's share of \$160,000 will come from Urban Renewal funds.

The URA Board previously approved funding for Phase 1 of the project. The City received an Oregon Transportation Commission Flexible Funds Program grant in the amount of \$2.1 million for Phase 1 with the Agency's grant match of \$599,034.

Construction of the project is expected to commence in the spring of 2014. Both phases will be constructed simultaneously.

Staff is requesting that the Council consider acceptance of this Phase 2 grant award. In addition, as a matter of "taking care of business", accept the Phase 1 grant award as well.

ADVANTAGES:

This project provides for public safety improvements and upgrade to the City's transportation infrastructure. The project is expected to have a positive economic impact to the community

DISADVANTAGES:

None

BUDGET IMPLICATIONS:

The City's match for the two-phase project is \$759,034 and will come from the Empire Urban Renewal District Fund. Total grant funding is \$3,487,200. Total project cost including engineering design and administration is \$4,246,234

ACTION REQUESTED:

Staff recommends that council accept the South Empire Boulevard Multi-Modal Project Phase

1 grant in the amount of \$2,100,000 and the Phase 2 grant in the amount of \$1,387,200 as well as authorize the City Manager to enter into Intergovernmental Agreements with Oregon Department of Transportation for each grant in order to administer the above improvements to Empire Boulevard.

Transportation Alternatives Program—Awards for FY 2014-2015 RESPONSE & ACCEPTANCE SHEET

Project Programming: Program year assignment for new projects depends on expected ready date and TAP funds availability. Most projects awarded in 2013 will be scheduled for construction in 2014 and 2015, with design funds available starting in FY 2014 (Oct. 2013 - Sept. 2014). Projects will be amended into the FY 2012-2015 Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (STIP) and will be carried forward into the FY 2015-2018 STIP.

Agencies awarded TAP projects must complete the ODOT Project Prospectus and sign an Inter-governmental Agreement (IGA) to program their projects. The target date for completing these tasks is <u>June 30, 2013</u>. The deadline is <u>August 31, 2013</u>. This allows projects to be ready for the first phase of funding early in FY 2014. Any project costs incurred before completing the programming process are <u>not eligible</u> for TAP reimbursement.

Prospectus: ODOT uses this form to clarify the project scope and purpose, and to identify responsibilities and potential issues during project development. This three-part form may be viewed at: http://www.oregon.gov/ODOT/HWY/LGS/Pages/Project_Scoping_and_Prospectus.aspx

Intergovernmental Agreement (IGA): This is a legal contract with ODOT that sets the terms for TAP projects. You will receive a project-specific agreement in conjunction with the project scoping process. Do not expect to change the standard text or Special Provisions as this language applies to all TAP projects and in some cases to all federally-funded projects that ODOT administers. The IGA will include the target timeline for your project a description of the monthly reporting requirements.

Assistance: ODOT staff will assist your agency as needed in scoping new projects and preparing the Prospectus forms. However, your agency is ultimately responsible for getting the Prospectus and IGA complete and signed before the August 31, 2013 deadline.

What to Do:

- Have all prospective signers review the standard IGA language immediately. Review the draft IGA when it's provided, and submit requested revisions to ODOT within 30 days.
- Meet on-site with the ODOT scoping team and provide information they need from you for the Prospectus. After ODOT review, complete the Prospectus and obtain signatures.
- Return signed copies of the Prospectus and IGA by <u>June 30, 2013</u> if possible (no later than August 31, 2013) to remain eligible for TAP funds in the 2014-2015 funding cycle.
