ISSUE Proclamation for National Public Works Week

BACKGROUND

National Public Works Week is observed each year during the third week of May. The week of May 18-24, 2014, which has been designated Public Works Week, has as its theme "Building for today, planning for tomorrow" recognizes that what we do today is vital to a sustainable and vibrant tomorrow. 
