ISSUE

Public Hearing amending Resolution 14-12

BACKGROUND

The budget Resolution 14-12 for fiscal year 2014-2015 was approved by the City Council on June 3, 2014 and is being brought back to the Council with an amendment as a housekeeping matter to insert the amount of the annual fire station debt service payment in the same paragraph as the rate per thousand of taxes to be imposed. In accordance with Oregon budget law, a public hearing before the City Council has been scheduled and published for the purpose of taking public input for the June 17, 2014 meeting.

ADVANTAGES

Following ORS 294 ensures the City is in compliance with Oregon budget law and adoption of the resolution provides the City with appropriation authority.

DISADVANTAGES

BUDGET

Adoption of the resolution amends the budget resolution for Fiscal Year 2014-2015 to accurately impose the fire station annual debt service payment.
