

In Wyoming (Rawlins) the community was modest in size and the demands on commissioners was in turn modest. In the capital of Nevada however, (Carson City) a community of 57,000, the responsibilities were quite heavy at times throughout my tenure(s) there for two full terms. I served for half of my eight years there as Chairman. In Wyoming , I was a city councilman for a term and had 4 + years on the Board of Adjustments (Zoning and Condemnation). I have significant experience also in water issues, as both Rawlins, Wyoming and Carson City, Nevada have water issues in which I was involved over the years of my appointments. 

1. Identify your experience, education, and training which would benefit the committee and the community.

Experience: Was an RN for 25 years, with a B.S. from USF in Human Relations & Organizational Behavior. Specialist in Critical Care and Hospital Administration as Supervisor and Director of Education.

Have started two non profits and various community groups (Project HOPE of Cambria, HealthWorks! TV in San Luis Obispo, GrayMatters!, HW TV Oregon, and Friends of Mingus Park [FOMP]).

HW TV Oregon was a collaborative between local hospitals of two counties, to sponsor community health education TV programs on Ch. 98. This was modeled after the successful HealthWorks! TV in San Luis Obispo, CA, which I started, had a 5-hour weekly time slot and aired over 50 hour-long shows that I produced.

HW TV Oregon included a series on Disaster Preparedness hosted by Mayor Shoji, and involved panelists discussing this topic for the pilot show of the series.

HW TV OR was administered by a board of directors that included local physicians and leaders in education. The experiences of bringing the community together to serve on the boards, produce many shows, find creative approaches to "Edu-tainment" helped to fine-tune successful methods of program development and community outreach and engagement.

Friends of Mingus Park is a group dedicated to the health and safety of the wildlife at Mingus, and was started following witnessed abuse toward the waterfowl there. Members work together to advocate and educate the park visitors. Currently there are 4 teenagers from NBHS who are volunteering to do presentations in grammar schools, telling the story of "Joey The Goose," who has become a symbol of triumph over abuse.

Was certified in Train the Trainer in Conflict Mediation Skills.

I have been doing community program development and education for 25 years, and was an appointee to the Children's Services Network of San Luis Obispo. Was campaign manager for Larry Houlgate for State Assembly, SLO, CA. and Media Director for Shirley Bianchi for County Supervisor, SLO, CA.

I walk frequently at Mingus Park, and am thankful that we have such beautiful parks in our county. I also believe that as a volunteer doing community service we are serving at the pleasure of the community.

I am also an award-winning composer of orchestral themes that have aired on TV, with the most recent being an orchestration which was presented at the United Nations.

Started Project HOPE of Cambria an after school program that involved Cal Poly students facilitating various "clubs." Science Club, Drama Club, Hockey Team, Save The Animals Club, and Journalism Clubs all went on to become the first Recreation Department of Cambria.

Advocated for a Peace Patrol program at the Cambria Grammar School. Despite overall community support by teachers and community members, the program was not started. Two years later there were two Peace Patrols in the school. The Shooting Stars Hockey Team was started which included kids in grammar school whose parents/guardians were working.

Project HOPE led to HealthWorks! TV in SLO, which involved community members presenting in a talk show format programs on public access TV. HW TV evolved following the suicide of a teen in Cambria who was being abused. Produced over 50 shows related to health, both medical and psychosocial in focus. As founder and director of HealthWorks! TV SLO-- I did grant writing to find funding for programming and production.

Developed the collaborative for HW TV Oregon involving Southern Coos Hospital, Bay Area Hospital, Coquille Valley Hospital and Waterfall.

HW TV Oregon collaborative resulted in only a few programs, but included a program called "The Group," hosted by 5 women of all ages who discussed how they each addressed obstacles and crises in their lives, and how they became thrivers despite various limitations. The "Flashmob For Health" was produced two years ago and involved over 100 community participants and dancers of all ages, with 4 camera operators, full sound. It was videotaped at Pony Village Mall and aired on TV as part of the HW TV series on Health.

The pilot show for the *Disaster Preparedness* series hosted by Mayor Shoji included a comedy sketch involving actors from LTOB and the south coast of Oregon. HW TV non profit was dissolved due to a variety of reasons-- namely it was not a "good fit" for the area.

CERT volunteer, and one of the original members of the Bandon Emergency Preparedness group. Convened two meetings of Emergency Preparedness leaders to provide oversight and direction with Emergency Preparedness series.

Friends of Mingus Park continues to be effective, with members of all ages participating. Members volunteer to do "Teachable Moments" at Mingus Park if abuse is noted toward any of the wildlife, or if unhealthy food items are given to the waterfowl. Over 100 free bags of healthy waterfowl pellets have been handed out to park visitors in the last year, and a large improvement in the level and quality of the food items has been observed. FOMP is thankful to the city for ensuring the survival of newborn ducks this last Spring, by installing a mesh grill over the drainage grill, which was requested by FOMP. Currently a collaborative between Morgan Veterinary Clinic and FOMP is actively addressing the emergency medical care needs for the waterfowl at Mingus Park-- as there is a Waterfowl Emergency Fund held at Morgan Vet where donations can be made to cover needed medical costs.
