ISSUE: External Evaluation of Coos Bay's Permitting Process

BACKGROUND:

As was previously shared during the September 16, 2014 Council meeting, John Hitt was contacted by the City to review the City's building permits and land use rules, procedures, standards, and overall effectiveness. Mr. Hitt was chosen based on his unique background which includes being a former elected official, economic development professional, and city manager.

During that process Mr. Hitt has met with and talked to City staff, contractors, architects, developers, and members of the local Chamber of Commerce. An informal survey was conducted to determine the level of satisfaction/dissatisfaction with the City's performance in these areas.

In addition, Mr. Hitt was tasked with making specific recommendations that might facilitate a more timely and simplified process for the public while still meeting the requirements of public safety as well as state and local law.
