**ISSUE:**      **Acceptance of funds for Pedestrian Safety Mini-Grant**

**BACKGROUND:**

Over the last several years, the Coos Bay Police Department has submitted for and received grant funds for participating in different traffic and pedestrian safety programs including the 3 Flags Safety Belt Enforcement campaign, the Coos County DUII Task Force, and now the Oregon Impact Pedestrian Safety Crosswalk Enforcement Grant. All of these programs are aimed at creating a safer environment for both pedestrians and the motoring public through education and enforcement of the motor vehicle codes.

For the 2015 Campaign period, Oregon Impact awarded the Coos Bay Police Department with \$4,993.30 to be used for overtime Traffic Safety Enforcement with emphasis on Pedestrian Crosswalk Safety.
