ISSUE: OLCC License Change of Ownership – Red lion Inn

BACKGROUND:

Oregon Revised Statute (ORS) 471.166 establishes the process for local governments to make recommendations to OLCC regarding approval of or denial of initial OLCC license renewals, applications and any additional privileges to their existing OLCC licenses. As part of the process, the Police Department reviews all initial and additional privilege applications to ensure compliance with applicable regulations. The City Council is charged with the responsibility for recommending approval or denial of these applications to the Oregon Liquor Control Commission bases on information submitted by the Police Department.

On August 04, 2016, representatives of the Red Lion Inn/Coos Bay submitted a proposal for a change of ownership for their exiting OLCC licenses. Records Supervisor Chris Esperance has reviewed the application, and conducted a records check on the new proposed applicants. The investigation revealed no information that would prohibit this change from being approved or prevent the issuance of the OLCC license change.
