Professional History:

1992-2001

Self employment in the pursuit of land purchase, planning, development, and sales in the residential sector on the west coast of the USA. Scale of the operation was moderate, with revenues averaging 1.5 M per year. Responsibilities required coordinating infrastructure planning with local authority, bidding, contracting and supervision of construction, and understanding economics and risk. Participation with local authority included membership in the Task Force for Development Code Revision (1998-99), and Board of Code Appeals (1998-99) Three subdivisions planned, built and sold in Springfield totaling over 100 lots.

1980-1992

Self employed at Ainslie Petroleum, a corporation of the State of Oklahoma. This position as 50% owner and chief operating partner involved complete and thorough management responsibility for prospect generation, finance/sales, drilling, and development of oil and gas projects in the Anadarko and Arkoma Basins of Oklahoma, Arkansas, Texas, and Kansas. This company was financed by a substantial, regional drilling company which formed a 50% ownership participation. As an experienced explorationist with formal and practical training in geology and geophysics, Mr. Krans generated prospects and reviewed prospects generated by others for investment and drilling. Acquisition of seismic data, both proprietary, and existing trade data, were utilized with normal geological subsurface correlation to perform necessary tasks to produce investment-worthy prospects. Land lease acquisition was directed by, and often negotiated by Mr. Krans. Liaison with managers and professionals from other companies and funds enabled the projects to be sold and financed for drilling. Projects had to pass rigorous tests for economics, size, and risk to meet industry standard for participation.

Participants included major oil companies and independent companies; some as operators, some as partners.

With technical and professional assistance, Mr. Krans was directly involved in, and responsible for operational drilling activities, well evaluation before and after casing, and well stimulation and completion. During the history of Ainslie Petroleum, from 1980 until 1992, the company participated in 162 wells. About 30% of these wells were operated in-house. By 1987, Ainslie Petroleum had 67 producing properties. These properties represented 4.5 MMBO, and 8.8 BCF of productive reserves.

In 1990, the partner drilling company was forced into bankruptcy by an unstable energy industry, and by 1992, Ainslie Petroleum was forced out of business.

1977-1980

Explorationist, Getty-Reserve Oil Company, Oklahoma City. Initially assigned to non-domestic areas, this position exposed Mr. Krans to exploration drilling offshore in the Gulf of Panama from a Glomar drill ship. Normal well site supervision on location was experienced in Panama and Nicaragua, and follow-up interpretation for basin analysis was conducted in the home office as part of this job. Also a subject of study was exploration of the Alaska North Slope, and exploration in the deep Anadarko Basin.

1970-1977

Explorationist, Mobil Oil and Mobil Oil Libya: Anchorage, AK, Denver, CO, Tripoli, Libya. First recruited and assigned to live and work in Alaska after receiving a Masters Degree, Mr. Krans enjoyed vast experience, both formal and practical, from Mobil. Assigned to a basin analysis group of well experienced geologists and geophysicists exploring a region which included several offshore basins and a major part of Alaska, this was the first exposure to oil exploration. Mobil provided formal courses in well log analysis, petroleum engineering, and geophysics. The first three years of work included a mix of field geology and geophysics, with magnetics, gravity, and magneto tellurics, along with well site work and office mapping. All of the senior professionals were highly experienced people. Mr. Krans was involved in most phases of the group endeavor, from geophysical processing to the annual budget preparation and presentation.

Upon moving the office to Colorado, Mr. Krans worked in the North Slope exploration group for Mobil. In 1975, Mr. Krans volunteered for, and was assigned to Mobil Libya in Tripoli, to work the Sirte Basin concessions. This group of explorationist professionals included a multi-national force of geologists and geophysicists from six countries. Each geologist was assigned with a geophysicist to work one concession. Field work was shared among all professionals.
