ISSUE:

Resolution Accepting an Oregon State Marine Board Grant

### SUMMARY:

City staff applied for and the City was awarded a grant for up to \$29,600 through Oregon State Marine Board (OSMB) to rehabilitate Empire Boat Ramp and Eastside Boat Ramp parking lots. The scope of work involves crack sealing, seal coating, and restriping both parking lots. The City match is 20% or up to \$7,400. The existence of the grant award was not foreseen at the time of the preparation of the budget for the current fiscal year. Therefore, Council will need to adopt Resolution 17-05 adopting a supplemental budget making appropriations and accepting the grant award.

## **ACTION REQUESTED:**

If it pleases the City Council, adopt Resolution 17-05 and authorize the City Manager to enter into an IGA with OSMB for the award of a \$29,600 grant to rehab Empire Boat Ramp and Eastside Boat Ramp parking lots.

### SUMMARY:

City staff applied for and the City was awarded a grant for \$29,600 through Oregon State Marine Board (OSMB) to rehabilitate Empire Boat Ramp and Eastside Boat Ramp parking lots. The scope of work involves crack sealing, seal coating, and restriping both parking lots. The City match is \$7,400.

### **ACTION REQUESTED:**

At the March 21st regular Council meeting, staff will request Council authorizes the City Manager to enter into an IGA with OSMB for the award of \$29,600 grant funds to rehab Empire Boat Ramp and Eastside Boat Ramp parking lots.

### BACKGROUND:

Parking lot pavement is typically designed to last between 15 and 30 years. The life of the pavement can be significantly extended through timely, appropriate maintenance. The Empire Boat Ramp and Eastside Boat Ramp parking lots are older than 15 years and should be crack sealed, seal coated, and restriped about every 3 years to extend the life of the pavement. OSMB had some extra funding available this year for parking lot maintenance. City staff successfully applied for receipt of some of those additional funds.

### **BUDGET IMPLICATIONS:**

The City match for this grant is 7,400, which will come from Boat Ramp Maintenance, GL # 01-306-520-2313. The work must be completed this fiscal year.
