ISSUE:

Discussion of proposed 5-Year Plan for Capital Improvement Projects (CIPs)

SUMMARY:

City Staff has prepared a 5-year plan for wastewater and storm water Capital Improvement Projects (CIPs). In total, there are 33 projects that range from storm and sanitary sewer replacements to pump station upgrades to treatment plant upgrades. Many of these projects have been identified in the City's Master Plans and Smoke Testing Reports. However, there are also a number of these projects that have been identified through video investigations by the City's collection crew. For the next two years, the majority of the project will be funded by the City's two Infrastructure Finance Authority Loans (IFA) and the Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) State Revolving Fund (SRF) program, the remainder of the projects will be funded by the Wastewater Improvement Fund.

ACTION REQUESTED:

Direct City Staff to proceed forward with the implementation of the 5-Year CIP plan. Prior to awarding either a professional services contract or a construction agreement for an amount that exceeds \$75,000, Staff will present scope and fee and/or bids to council at a regularly scheduled council meeting for approval.

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BACKGROUND:

The City's sewer systems have increased flow in the winter due to the Oregon Coast weather conditions (intense storms, high ground water, and tidal influence) and are difficult to repair and replace. Therefore; it is not common practice to perform construction projects in the winter and early spring, unless it is an emergency. In order to maximize the construction season (summer and early fall), Staff must plan these projects utilizing several tools that consists of Master Plans, (for both the storm and sanitary sewer system), the Smoke Testing Report, and video inspections of the City's storm and sanity sewer system. The projects are then prioritized based on the seriousness of the deficiency identified and the size of the system. Other items of consideration are as follows:

- Is the infrastructure located along a major road (arterial or collector)?
- Is the infrastructure located along a road near schools and/or hospitals?

How will the project be funded?

Staff is asking council to consider approving the 5-Year CIP plan with the understanding that this plan may be modified as other deficiencies are identified or the priorities change. See attached for plan and exhibit.

Fund 29, Department 810 Account Number 530-3010 is for Emergency Projects. Funding for a portion of the projects, not funded by the loans identified above, can be obtained from this fund. While the projects for 2017 have been accounted for in approved budget (FYE 2017 and 2018), it is recommended that staff coordinate with the Financial Consultant (Donovan Enterprises) to see what impacts the future projects may have on wastewater user rates. Additionally, the Financial Consultant should also advise the City if these future projects should be paid from user rates or if additional loans should be pursued or a combination of both.
