Tanner began his hiring process approximately a year ago; and after an arduous selection and background process, he was selected to attend R.O.T.A. (reserve officer training academy). <u>CITY WELCOMES DONATION</u> - The City of Coos Bay has accepted a generous offer from Knife River Corporation, with a local office at 3055 Ocean Boulevard in Coos Bay, to restripe two parking lots in John Topits Park at no cost to the City. LIBRARY BOARD WELCOMES TWO NEW BOARD MEMEBERS - James Moore and Anthony Farmer were recently appointed to fill recent vacancies on the Coos Bay Library Board. The Library Board is charged with formulating the rules and policies for the governance of the library, assisting with the annual budget preparation, and approving of library related expenditures.

COUNCIL WILL CONSIDER NEW DEVELOPMENT CODE: - Cities within the State of Oregon are required to write, maintain, and adopt a development code as a part of its overall municipal code. Coos Bay has had a code for many years, and it is currently adopted as Chapter 17 of its municipal code. The current City's code was primarily written in 1987, and it has had some minor modifications since that date. Staff has now finished the process of rewriting a draft code per the City's goal for this year and the previous direction it was given by the City Council. The Planning Commission spent approximately eight months working on the code in a series of work sessions and a public hearing with the purpose of gathering public opinion and writing a draft document that reflects the majority opinion for development within the City of Coos Bay. With a unanimous favorable decision from the Planning Commission, the code went to the City Council for three work sessions.

A copy of the draft development code can be found on line at the City's website at www.coosbay.org. A town hall meeting will be scheduled in the near future where staff will provide a presentation on the proposed changes to the current development code. After the town hall meeting, a public hearing will be scheduled before the Council considers adopting the draft code.

The main goals of the development code rewrite proposal are to:

- 1. Provide a new land use review format which will be easier for applicants to follow,
- 2. Provide clear and objective language for applicants,
- 3. Establish conformity within the pre-application process,
- 4. Delete many unnecessary reviews for proposed uses, and
- 5. Delete some of the unnecessary zonings within the City.
