NEW CARDIAC MONITORS AT THE FIRE DEPARTMENT - The Coos Bay Fire Department is conducting training on new cardiac monitors this week, and they are planning to have them on the trucks ready for use by this weekend. The heart monitors, one for Empire and one for downtown, were purchased with community grant funds from Bay Area Hospital and the Confederated Tribes. These lifesaving devices are replacing ten year old defibrillators that have less flexibility for trained rescuers. The Fire Department is grateful to the Bay Area Hospital Community Foundation and to the Three Rivers Community Foundation for their generous partnership in improving pre-hospital care to our residents.

ENVISION YOUR 21ST **CENTURY LIBRARY!** - Community members are invited to share their vision of a 21st century Coos Bay Public Library at a community meeting at the Coos Bay City Hall's Council Chambers on Saturday, May 2^{nd} from 2:00 pm - 3:30 pm.

- Brush must be placed by the curb <u>prior</u> to May 4th.
- Brush must be placed in one pile (no more than 5 feet in length and no more than 5 cubic yards in size)
- Only one brush pile per address.
- No grass clipping, sod, dirt, loose leaves, plastic bags, etc.
