City Manager's Office (541) 269-8912 **IT'S ALL HAPPENING AT THE LIBRARY** – The Friends of the Coos Bay Public Library will be hosting anther book sale this weekend - June  $6^{th}$  and  $7^{th}$ . Sale hours are Saturday from 10:00 am – 4:00 pm and Sunday from 12:00 pm to 4:00 pm.

June 9<sup>th</sup> – Roger Ott and Lionel Youst will offer a glimpse into "how it was" in earlier days in Coos County when they present Wagon Roads and Milk Boat Loads - Getting Around Coos County in the Early Days. The presentation will be held in the myrtlewood room beginning at 7:00 pm.

June 11<sup>th</sup> – Come listen to Dr. Roberty Zyback as he talks about the Coquille Trails -Early Historical Roads and Trails of Ancestral Coquille Indian Lands from 1926-1875. Dr. Zyback will present findings from an ongoing project to investigate and publish a "Cultural Geography" of the modern Coquille Indian Tribe. A description of the physical landscape and geographic area occupied or utilized by the ancestors of the modern Coquille Tribe prior to, and at the time of, the earliest reported contacts with Europeans and Euro-Americans. The presentation will be held in the myrtlewood room beginning at 7:00 pm.

**ROAD MAINTENANCE ON OCEAN BLVD** - The Coos Bay-North Bend Water Board is continuing work on a water main replacement project on Ocean Boulevard between the Water Board's driveway entrance and Woodland Drive. The work is being performed by the Water Board's contractor Laskey-Clifton Corporation. The remaining work consists of asphalt paving only. One west-bound lane of Ocean Boulevard will be closed this weekend June 6<sup>th</sup> & 7<sup>th</sup>. The project will include night time work on Sunday, June 7<sup>th</sup> starting at 7:00 pm and ending by 7:00 am and on Monday, June 8<sup>th</sup> from 7:00 pm to 7:00 am the following morning.

While continuous traffic flow will be maintained, motorists are asked to reduce speeds and use caution through the construction area. Alternatively, motorists are encouraged to use other routes when practical. All work on the project is anticipated to be complete by Friday, June 12<sup>th</sup>.
