

STATUS OF A POSSIBLE GAS TAX - In last week's update, I shared about the recent (since 2013) collective efforts of the Council, staff, and citizens to assess and address our deteriorating street infrastructure here in Coos Bay. Coos Bay and North Bend are in the same boat regarding the condition of our streets and the lack of funds needed to maintain the necessary but expensive infrastructure. Both cites have completed an assessment of the respective streets, and the Councilor's from North Bend and Coos Bay have approved a PP&L Franchise fee increase to help cover the costs of keeping the street lights on at night (both cities have been using state gas tax revenue to pay this expense in the past). This will free up some state gas tax dollars for street maintenance. Unfortunately, that alone will not be enough to overcome years of deferred maintenance; and as such, we have been looking at a gas tax.

This was Sergeant Shaffer's second consecutive year of participating in this event. This sprint event consisted of a ½ mile swim followed by a 12 mile bicycle race, and ends with a 3.1 mile run. Sergeant Robert Lounsbury participated in the Subaru Sponsored Canadian Iron Man Triathlon that was held in Whistler British Columbia on Sunday, July 26th. This was also Sergeant Lounsbury's second consecutive year participating in this world event, and his third overall Iron Man Triathlon that he has competed in. Sergeant Lounsbury finished 10th in his age group and 91st overall out of 1,949 participants. The Iron Man Triathlon consists of a 2.4 mile swim, followed by a 112 mile bicycle race, and finishes with a full 26.2 mile marathon run. Sergeant Lounsbury finished his race in a very impressive time of 10:47:18. Sergeant Lounsbury will take a short break and then begin training for the Phoenix Iron Man being held in Arizona in October of 2015. **Congratulations Robert and Good Luck in Phoenix.**



<u>I WANT TO KNOW</u> – I been asked in the past about permitting and just how many building and/or land use permits do we process. I didn't know the exact number, but a quick check revealed that for the last seven months (January 1st – July 30th) 467 permits had been processed. Those permits run the gambit from sidewalk permits, curb cuts, structural demolitions, mechanical, site development, residential and commercial structures etc. This doesn't include the special event permits (events held on public property like Mingus Park, the Boardwalk, etc.) which generally run around 70 events a year. Another astounding statistic is the number of inspections our Building Official single handedly has conducted this year - over 1,100 inspections!!!

A majority of the permits processed are for projects regulated by either the City's Development Code and/or the Building Codes.

City Manager's Office (541) 269-8912 <u>UPDATING THE CITY'S DEVELOPMENT CODE</u> - The City of Coos Bay will be holding a Town Hall meeting to discuss the proposed draft Development Code that the City has been reviewing since May 2014. The Town Hall meeting will be held on August 11th at 6:00 pm in the City Council Chamber's.

Since May 2014, the Planning Commission and City Council have been holding a series of public meetings and work sessions on the proposed Development Code and map revisions. The main goals of the revisions are to:

- 1. Provide a new land use review format which will be easier for applicants to follow.
- 2. Provide clear and objective language for applicants,
- 3. Establish conformity within the pre-application process,
- 4. Delete many unnecessary reviews for proposed uses, and
- 5. Delete some of the unnecessary zonings within the City.

At the end of this process, the City will have a new, legally reviewed, easier to follow Development Code and associated maps which along with the City's Comprehensive Plan directs development within the City.

Please come and share your thoughts or questions you may have on the proposed new code with City staff as the City moves through this process.
