FREE CPR CLASS - Coos Bay Fire & Rescue will be sponsoring an Adult Family & Friends Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) course. The Family & Friends CPR Course teaches the lifesaving skills of adult Hands-Only® CPR, child CPR with breaths, adult and child AED use, infant CPR and relief of choking in an adult, child, or infant. Skills are taught in a dynamic group environment by using the American Heart Association's (AHA) research-proven practice-while-watching technique which provides students with the most hands-on CPR practice time possible. Family & Friends CPR is for people who want to learn CPR but do not need a course completion card in CPR for their job. This course is ideal for schools and students, new parents, grandparents, babysitters, and others interested in learning how to save a life.



The course will be given on Thursday, October 22, 2015 from 6:00 pm to 8:00 pm, and it will be held at the Coos Bay Fire Department's main station located at 450 Elrod Avenue. There is no charge for this class, but pre-registration is required. TRACKING DOWN CRIMINALS - During the early morning hours of October 14th, Coos Bay Police Officer Krebs drove passed a vehicle with two female occupants near the Staples store. Believing the car may have been stolen, he turned around and began searching for it. He found the car in the Wal-Mart parking lot, unoccupied. Officer Krebs was able to confirm the car was in fact stolen, and the license plates had been switched.

Other officers responded to the area including Sergeant Sean Merritt and his K9 partner Tron. Officer Krebs located the passenger from the vehicle, Janice Sanders, and she was taken into custody. A quick check of the video surveillance revealed the operator of the vehicle was Trisha Littles who had an active warrant for her arrest. With the help of K9 Tron, Ms. Littles was located in a wooded area to the west of Wal-Mart; and she was taken into custody for the warrant and also charged with Unauthorized Use of a Vehicle. Littles will also be referred to the District Attorney's Office for Unlawful Possession of Methamphetamine and Possession of Stolen Property.
