PD Catches Car Thief

During the early hours yesterday morning, a local resident call 911 to report that someone had just stolen his car. The vehicle owner had just started his car, but he ran back into his home to retrieve an item he needed for work. By the time he came back out of his house, his car was gone.

In less than an hour, Officer Lindal found the vehicle on Ocean Boulevard. Officer Lindal attempted to stop the vehicle, but the operator 18 year old Brandon Birman did not stop; and he tried to elude the officer. The pursuit headed south on Cape Arago Highway, through Barview, and back into the south end of Coos Bay via Libby Lane. While on Libby Lane, a Coos Bay Police Officer and a Coos County Sheriff's Deputy successful deployed stop sticks which effectively deflated both front tires on the vehicle.

Birman continued to flee even though both front tires were separated from the rim. Birman was not able to steer the vehicle, and he struck a curb on Southwest Boulevard near the Englewood Market. Birman was taken into custody without incident. Birman was transported to the Coos County jail on the charges of Unauthorized Use of a Motor Vehicle, Attempting to Elude, and Reckless Driving. The Coos County Sheriff's Department, North Bend Police Department, and Oregon State Police assisted with pursuit and aprehensive of Birman.



Birman was also suspected of unlawfully entering other vehicles in the 900 block of South 11th Street prior to stealing the vehicle.
