#### **Tsunami Evacuation Drill**

Today marks the five year anniversary of the magnitude 9.0 earthquake and subsequent tsunami that struck the Japanese coastline. The City of Coos Bay will be partnering with the Oregon Office of Emergency Management, along with many coastal communities in Oregon, and will be conducting an evacuation drill or "Tsunami Walk Out" this afternoon at 3:00 pm.

This is a voluntary evacuation exercise, but the City asks that the residents, business owners, and visitors in low elevation areas use this opportunity to practice their escape route to a recognized "Assembly Area". The Assembly Areas will be the community's information outlet for those wanting to learn about the extent of damage, how to reconnect with loved ones, where to find food, water or temporary shelter, and what recovery efforts are underway.

Assembly areas in Coos Bay include:

- Madison Elementary School
- Salvation Army Church
- Cranberry Sweets (parking lot)
- CB School District offices (old Milner Crest School)
- Harmony United Methodist Church
- Marshfield High School (East Branch Parking Lot)
- Millicoma Middle School

To find your closest Assembly Area or evacuation route, you can find a map at <a href="https://www.oregontsunami.org">www.oregontsunami.org</a> or you can get a map at the Coos Bay Fire Station No. 1 at 450 Elrod Avenue.

There will be no reminders or sirens to indicate the start of the drill; but if this were a real emergency, the

violent shaking ground would be the most reliable indicator that a tsunami is possible, and it's time to get to high ground. You should time yourself to determine how long it takes to get out of the hazard area. Most experts believe that (depending on conditions) we can expect the first of many tsunami waves to arrive within 20 minutes following a local earthquake. So don't waste any time...Walk Out with us!

### Report a Problem Streetlight

What can you do if you notice a Coos Bay streetlight that is out or working intermittently? Please call the City of Coos Bay Public Works Department, and speak to or leave a message with Operations Superintendent Jon Eck. Jon's telephone number is 541-297-3810, and his email address is <a href="mailto:jeck@coosbay.org">jeck@coosbay.org</a>. The streetlights on metal poles belong to and are maintained by the City. Please be prepared to provide Jon the nearest cross streets or landmark. There may be a number on the pole as well which you can include in your communication with Jon if you have it. The City also owns the black metal period style lights in the downtown and along Newmark Avenue in Empire. Please report the nearest cross streets for those lights also. The streetlights on wooden poles are maintained by PacifiCorp. If you contact Jon with the nearest cross streets and pole number (if you find it), Jon will contact PacifiCorp with a request to repair and investigate.
