# A Changing of the Guard at City Hall...






Mayor Crystal Shoji (pictured to the left) served as Coos Bay's Mayor since November 2010.

# **Volunteer Committee Openings...**



The City of Coos Bay is seeking volunteers to fill positions on the Budget Committee, Design Assistance Team, Parks Commission, and the Coos Bay/North Bend Water Board. Applications are available from the City Manager's Office at City Hall, by calling 541-269-8912, or on the City's website at <a href="www.coosbay.org">www.coosbay.org</a> Applications will be accepted in the City Mangers Office through 5:00 p.m. <a href="December 8">December 8</a>, <a href="2016">2016</a>. Applicants will be contacted to schedule interviews with the City Council.

**Budget Committee** – Applicants must be a resident of the City of Coos Bay, and they are appointed by the City Council for three-year terms. The meetings are held in April at 7:00 p.m. **There are currently two openings** on the Budget Committee.

<u>Design Assistance Team</u> – The Design Review Committee acts as an advisory body to the City of Coos Bay Community Development Department, Planning Commission, City Council, and Urban Renewal Agency. Members may include any person possessing interest in furthering the betterment of historic, cultural, architectural, natural or artistic resources in the Coos Bay area. Applicants should have knowledge and expertise in one of the following areas: a) Local History; b) art, graphics, or interior design; c) architecture. There are currently three openings on the Committee.

<u>Parks Commission</u> – Membership is comprised of one Councilor, one Planning Commissioner, one representative of a service club, one representative of the landscape design profession or business, one representative of the design profession, and three citizen-at-large positions. **There are three openings** on the committee - two citizen-at-large and one design professional. Applicants must be a resident of the City of Coos Bay or own property in the City. The Parks Commission meets once a month, although during winter months if there are no items to bring to the Commission, meetings are not held.

Coos Bay-North Bend Water Board – Ordinance No. 285 codified by Coos Bay Municipal Code Chapter 2.50 established membership on the Board. Applicants must be a resident of the City of Coos Bay for a period of not less than one year prior to appointment. Board meetings are held once a month at 7:00 a.m. at the Water Board office. Appointments are for four years. There is one opening on the Board.

<u>Library Board</u> - The Library Board, Coos Bay Municipal Code 2.25, was established

by Ordinance No. 57 and consists of seven members. The term of office is four years; up to three board members may at any one time reside in Coos County within the boundaries of School Dist. 9, but outside the city limits of Coos Bay. Members shall be limited to serving no more than two full consecutive terms; however, any person may be reappointed after an interval of one year. **There is currently one opening** on the Board.



## Monthly Car Seat Clinic...

When children are properly restrained, it significantly decreases the severity of injuries and number of fatalities that occur in a crash. Oregon's law reflects national best practices.



To assist drivers that travel with children, Coos Bay Fire Department serves as the host site for a monthly car seat clinic. The clinic is sponsored by the Coos County Child Safety Seat Coalition that is comprised of several partner agencies throughout Coos County. The agencies represented are Bay Area Hospital, Coos Bay Police Department, Coos Bay Fire Department,

Coquille Indian Tribal Police, Oregon Department of Human Services, Oregon Department of Transportation, Oregon State Police, and South Coast Head Start.

Through many successful clinics, the coalition has found some significant issues in how drivers install child safety seats incorrectly. Some of the major ones are the wrong seat for the child or not installed correctly. The coalition members instruct drivers on the proper techniques for installation and sizing of car seats to help keep them in compliance with the law.

Saving Lives...

Currently the car seat clinic is offered on the second Tuesday of each month from 11am to 1pm, but Coos Bay Fire Department has two child safety seat technicians on staff who can arrange individual education and assistance for those who may not be able to attend the regularly scheduled clinic.
