



Southport Donates Wood for Disaster Preparedness

The Fire Department was the recipient of a generous gift last month, and it was just



in time for Christmas. In October, several members of the Fire Department and the local Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) participated in training on post-earthquake damage assessment and urban search and rescue. The class included instructions on how to use cribbing and shoring to make an unstable structure safe enough to allow rescue efforts. Cribbing and shoring uses pieces of lumber to stabilize or support a potential hazard.

One of our volunteer firefighters who attended the class works for Southport Lumber Company in North Bend. After hearing about the class, Southport was willing to donate 90 pieces of lumber valued at about \$450. On December 20th, staff received a truck load of 4 x 4 lumber. In the coming weeks, the wood will be cut into 2 foot lengths and some will be cut into wedges. The cribbing will be stored at the three fire stations, and



they will be available for training and emergency response. Eventually the Fire Department would like to equip a cargo trailer with these and other rescue tools in order to expedite deployment.
