**FIRE SEASON IN EFFECT** - Fire season is in effect throughout the county. Outdoor burning is still allowed in the city limits of Coos Bay and does not require a written permit. Yard debris may be burned in an open fire on the ground and paper/cardboard can be burned in a burn barrel with a screen on top. Any commercial business or land clearing burns must obtain a permit to burn from D.E.Q. Due to the strong summer winds and increasing dryness of grass and other fuels the Fire Department urges everyone to exercise caution when doing any outdoor burning. **SAFETY TOWN RECOGNITION** - The Police Department wrapped up another summer session of Safety Town for South Coast area youngsters. **PERIODIC REVIEW TASK PASSES PLANNING COMMISSION** - At its meeting Tuesday evening, the Planning Commission reviewed proposed changes to the Coos Bay Estuary Management Plan and recommended approval of the proposal to the City Council. The proposal is scheduled to go before the Council on September 18th. The changes are in response to State requirements.
