RED CROSS BLOOD DRIVE - The next blood drive scheduled for our community will be held Wednesday, September 19th from 1 to 6 p.m. at Pony Village Mall. From a call to Red Cross Thursday morning, city staff learned that additional blood drives have not been scheduled for our area due to the Oregon Red Cross' response to New York City's needs. Red Cross personnel urge local residents wishing to donate blood to call to make an appointment by contacting Alice or Christi at 1-800-792-5682. The hours for donating blood on Wednesday will be extended as long as needed.

<u>ALL CITY FLAGS AT HALF-STAFF</u> - The international flag display along the bay and flags in the downtown area have been changed to American flags and will be flown at half-staff until further notice from the Governor's office.

BAY AREA FUN FESTIVAL - Join the "Fiesta of Fun" this Saturday and Sunday at various locations throughout the Bay Area. Featuring the Prefontaine Memorial 10K run and 2-mile walk, Cruz the Coos rolling car show, Coos Sand 'n Sea Quilt Show, Cruz the Coos Poker run, Coos Bay Waterfront open house, Fiesta of Fun Parade, US Coast Guard water rescue demonstrations, the mall market, food court, live entertainment and much more. The parade is at 1 p.m. beginning on 4th Street following the downtown parade route down 4th Street to Commercial Avenue to Second Street. The Museum will also expand its hours on Saturday, September 15th and Sunday, September 16th to accommodate crowds visiting downtown Coos Bay for the annual "Fun Fest" and the Museum's popular "Beer Garden" event. Coos Art Museum will be open September 15 from 10:00 a.m. - 7:00 p.m. and September 16 from 1:00 - 4:00 p.m.. The popular Harley exhibit features more than thirty original historic motorcycles and dozens of related artifacts documenting the design history of Harley-Davidson. Viewers are encouraged to judge for themselves why it is that these designs have for decades famously symbolized a freethinking, free-spirited and unconventional American approach which has resonated world-wide.

<u>FARMER'S MARKET</u> - Just a reminder that the Farmer's Market is held every Wednesday during the summer months in the parking lot next to the Chamber of Commerce. This is the second year the Downtown Association has sponsored the market and it has been a popular shopping area for residents and visitors.

THREE FLAGS SAFETY BLITZ - The Coos Bay Police Department will be participating in a traffic safety blitz with law enforcement agencies throughout Oregon, Washington, and British Columbia. The grant funded traffic safety program aimed at safety belt compliance and child safety. The Three Flags campaigns are run concurrently in Oregon, Washington, and British Columbia. The safety blitz will run from September 15th through September 24th.

POLICE DEPARTMENT TO RECEIVE BLOCK GRANT FUNDS - For the fourth consecutive year the Coos Bay Police Department will be receiving law enforcement block grant funding. The Police Department will use the grant funds for the purchase of safety equipment and other departmental needs. The Police Department will be receiving \$10,520 in this years grant distribution.

POLICE OFFICERS ATTEND ELDER ABUSE TRAINING - Sergeant Ron Robson, Corporal David Main, along with Officers Terrie Gale and Andy Osborn attended an Elder Abuse Workshop in Eugene this week.

K-9 CUTTER RECEIVES I.D. CARD - When newly assigned School Resource Officer Rodger Craddock received his Coos Bay Schools identification card, he was surprised to see that the Police Department's Narcotics dog, Cutter, was also issued a photo identification card as well. To our knowledge Cutter is the first K-9 to receive a photo identification card from Coos Bay Schools.

NEW ARTWORK UNVEILED AT BOARDWALK - New artwork on the aquarium was unveiled Friday morning at the Boardwalk. The Confederated Tribes of the Coos, Lower Umpqua and Siuslaw Indians, Oregon Department of Fish & Wildlife and the City of Coos Bay officials unveiled the new artwork at 9:00 a.m. The work was solicited by the Tribe and work was performed by local artist David Smith. The entire aquarium project is a partnership of the three entities. Look for more interesting and exciting information around the aquarium in the future, as other improvements take place.

TRANSPORTATION SYSTEM PLAN - In July, Coos Bay and North Bend were awarded Transportation Growth Management Grants for \$90,000 each to develop Transportation System Plans. The two cities will be working together on common regional work issues to ensure coordinated plans and to make the most efficient use of the grant dollars. The purpose of the plans is to provide guidance in developing the area's transportation system through the identification of local needs and the development of preferred solutions, protection and enhancement of state and local transportation facilities and services.

BRUSH PICK-UP IS COMING - The semi-annual brush pick-up is fast approaching. The local garbage haulers will begin on October 1, 2001 to pick-up brush in Coos Bay.
