GUESTS VISIT COOS BAY FROM INDONESIA - Guests from Bitung, Indonesia arrived in Coos Bay on Sunday and have spent a week touring City, Water Board, Port and Southwestern College facilities in the Bay Area. James Rompas, Public Works and Planning Director; Leopold Dalope, Finance Director; and Max Lumempouw, Port of Bitung Manager were met at the airport by City Attorney Randall Tosh. COOS ART MUSEUM RECEIVES PARTNERSHIP FOR CONSERVATION GRANT - Coos Art Museum recently announced receiving a grant of Artcare conservation products from Neilsen & Bainbridge, LLC, a well-known supplier of framing and conservation materials to the fine arts community. According to CAM Administrator Reed Lockhart, the materials, including Alpharag mat board and Artcare archival foamboard, were a great help in preparing works from the Museum's Permanent Collection for the current and very popular "WoodWorks" exhibit. Many of the pieces in "WoodWorks" are newly framed, and available to the viewing public for the first time at the Museum. In commenting on the grant of materials used in framing and conserving the works for exhibit, Acqusition Committee Chair Del Smith said: "We very much appreciate the assistance of Neilsen & Bainbridge. In supplying archival materials to the Museum, the company has helped us to display works which might have otherwise gone unseen. Perhaps even more important, the recently framed works will be well protected for the enjoyment of future generations." <u>FIRE DEPARTMENT ISO REVIEW</u> - The fire department was host this week to a representative from the Insurance Services Office. The ISO representative was here to review fire department records, water systems infrastructure and communications systems. This periodic review is to determine if the fire department has improved in these areas since the last review in 1988 and warrant a change in the classification rating. Insurance companies utilize the fire department classification rating as a factor in determining insurance premiums. The results of the review will take approximately 8 to 12 months to compile and get notification back to the fire department.
