BUDGET COMMITTEE ADVANCES CITY BUDGET — Last night the Coos Bay Budget Committee — with a near unanimous vote — approved the City's proposed FY 1999-2000 budget. The grand total for all funds is nearly \$25 million, with \$8.6 million of that planned for capital expenditures for a streets, urban renewal projects and a new pool bath house at Mingus Park. The City's General Fund, which is supported mostly by property taxes and franchise fees, totals nearly \$7.6 million — up \$385,000 from this year.

Copies of the Budget Committee's "approved" budget are available for inspection at the Coos Bay Public Library and at City Hall. The City Council will next hold a hearing on the budget on June 15th. Adoption is likely at that time.
