<u>WORKSHOP SCHEDULED</u> – A workshop to discuss the proposed Front Street redevelopment plan has been scheduled for Tuesday, August 15, 2000 at 5:30 p.m. in the Port of Coos Bay conference room, 125 Central Avenue. The public is welcome to attend.

BROWNFIELD UPDATE – The first phase of the environmental site assessments is nearing completion for properties within the Waterfront Heritage District along North Front Street. Voluntary participation by the affected owners is an encouraging 86 percent. The properties will be ranked according to potential cleanup needs and the selected parcels choosing to continue with the EPA grant program will move into the next phase of assessment.

<u>LIBRARY SUMMER READING DRAWS TO A SUCCESSFUL CLOSE</u> – Hundreds of children have participated in Coos Bay Library's Summer Reading Program, reading lots of books and enjoying six fabulous special performances. Best of all, children and parents have told staff how the whole program has provided the incentive to read, read! Grand prize winners will be announced this Saturday. No programs or story times are scheduled for the month of August but a wonderful array of children's programs and events is set to begin in September.

THE LIBRARY WELCOMES A NEW REFERENCE LIBRARIAN – Dianne Zarder has accepted the position of reference librarian at Coos Bay Public Library, replacing Nancy Freeman who left recently to return to college and to teaching. Dianne comes to the library after serving as Director at the Curry Public Library in Gold Beach for the past three years. Prior to that she was Reference Referral Center Librarian at OSU's Valley Library, answering research questions for the region's libraries and training librarians in reference techniques. Her Masters in Library Science is from the University of North Texas. Her home has long been in Coos Bay and several years ago she worked as coordinator of the Coos County Cooperative Library System. She is a most welcome addition to the library staff and begins work August 23rd.

The Enterprise Center is located across the street from the North Bend Airport and is in the North Bend Business Park. The Center is a business incubator, which means they incubate a new business for three years and offer services and support to help them succeed. <u>DOWNTOWN PARKING</u> – The City Council is requesting that downtown merchants ask their employees to park away from areas that would be used by shoppers and business visitors. The City Council met in a work session recently with the Parking Committee to discuss changes to the current parking system. Although the Council did not establish additional timed parking areas, they did agree to look into purchasing property for the purpose of developing parking lots. At the City Council's direction, city staff will prepare a flyer for distribution to merchants requesting consideration be given for freeing up parking for shoppers and visitors.

<u>WELCOME RESERVE OFFICER MALONE</u> – James 'Chris' Malone was sworn in as Coos Bay Police Departments newest Reserve Police Officer earlier this week. Chris and his wife live in the Coos Bay.
