<u>K-9 PROGRAM TRAINING AND EVALUATION</u> - Police Department K-9 Team Supervisor Sergeant Kevin Hedgepeth attended a training with the Springfield Police Department this week. As the team supervisor, Sergeant Hedgepeth deals with issues of training, team management, civil liability issues, K-9 and Handler training, and other issues relating to the K-9 and applications. Officer Andy Osborne and K-9 Caesar attended one day for K-9 evaluation.

FIRE STATION GETS NEW RAMP - City public works crews will begin demolition work on the ramp at the downtown Coos Bay Fire Station. The work will be done in sections to allow for access by the emergency vehicles housed there. The help of the public works crew will result in a significant cost savings for this project. Construction is expected to continue through the month of September so please be watchful of workers in the roadway during this time. This project is part of the fire departments on-going capital improvement projects.

ANDERSON ALTERNATIVE MOVES AHEAD - The first phase of the Anderson Alternative for turning

Anderson into a two-way street from Bayshore to 2nd Street was completed this week. The City Street crew moved the centerline north on Anderson from 4th Street to 2nd Street to accommodate for the new diagonal parking along the south side of Anderson. The parking doubled the amount of existing parking spaces from 8 to 16. A new crosswalk was installed on the west side of 3rd Street to replace the one eliminated from the east side of 3rd because of the new parking spaces. Signal changes to affect the two-way configuration are expected in early November.

NEWMARK AVENUE WIDENING PROJECT UNDER DISCUSSION - The City Council met in special session Wednesday, August 29th, to discuss options for moving forward with the Newmark Avenue Widening Project. Proposals for engineering services related to the multi-phase project have been received, and the Council is determining the next steps. Under consideration is using Empire Urban Renewal funds to assist with design of the project, and potentially to assist with paying for the widening project. The Council will consider the issue again at its meeting on September 18th when staff brings back additional information regarding the engineering process. The goal continues to be to develop five lanes from Fir Street to the "Y," however, there is not yet a clear picture of how the develop could be afforded, and development of three lanes from LaClair to the "Y," that could be further developed to five lanes at a future date, may be an option.

COAST MANAGEMENT GRANT PROGRAM - Planning Administrator Laura Barron, along with representatives from other south coast cities and counties, attended a meeting in Winchester Bay on Tuesday with the Oregon Department of Land Conservation and Development. As directed by the legislative Ways and Means Committee, the meeting was held to discuss options for the allocation of coastal management grants for the fiscal year 2001-2002. The legislature has targeted an additional \$340,000 for Coastal Management Grant Funds. No decisions for the allocation of funding was made. Methods discussed for the allocation of funding included population, need, growth, staffing base, resource issues and the amount of shore land in the jurisdiction.
