CITY BUDGET COMMITTEE MEETINGS PROGRESS - The Coos Bay Budget Committee met in three regular sessions this week, working hard to grasp the magnitude of challenges confronting the community this year, reviewing presentations from City Manager Bill Grile and department heads, hearing presentations by non-profit organizations needing funding assistance to continue their own missions, and discussing ideas for ways to enhance city revenues and prevent service cuts. The Committee picks up its work again next Tuesday evening at the CB Public Library. That meeting starts at 7:00 p.m. and like all meetings is open to the public.
