**CITY OF COOS BAY TESTIMONY SUPPORTS VOTER CHOICE FOR PROPOSED AIRPORT DISTRICT** --

Wednesday evening City Manager Bill Grile delivered the City Council's sentiments about the proposed countywide airport district at a public hearing held by the Coos County Board of Commissioners in North Bend. Paraphrasing a letter for the Council by Mayor Joe Benetti, the city manager encouraged the Commissioners to place the proposed countywide district before the voters to let them decide if they support the idea. Coos Bay continues to be a strong supporter of the North Bend Municipal Airport due to its importance as a regional transportation hub and economic development asset. Mayor Benetti's letter acknowledges that questions may arise about various specific elements of the proposed district but that there will be plenty of time between now and November to consider these. Supporters of the proposed district reason that the financial burden of supporting the airport should be shared regionally by those benefiting from it, and that without additional support the airport's commercial air service is in jeopardy.
