

ORDINANCE NO. 287

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 103 PROVIDING FOR THE LICENSING TRADES, SHOPS, OCCUPATIONS, PROCESSIONS, BUSINESSES AND CALLINGS FOR THE PURPOSE OF REVENUE AND REGULATION; PROVIDING PENALTIES THEREFORE

The City of Coos Bay does ordain as follows:

Section 1. Section 3, Non-Profit Organizations, is amended to read as follows:

Section 3. Non-Profit Organizations. All non-profit organizations doing business in the City shall register with the City by filling out a business license application. Upon receipt of a completed application, which may include a requirement of proof of the organization's non-profit, tax-exempt status, the Finance Department shall issue a business license, which shall be issued without charge.

Section 2. Severability. The sections and subsections of this ordinance are severable. The invalidity of any one section or subsection shall not affect the validity of the remaining sections or subsections.

Section 3. Emergency. Because the prompt and continuous enforcement of the City of Coos Bay ordinance for licensing of trades, shops, occupations, professions, businesses and callings is necessary to the peace, health, and safety of the people of the City of Coos Bay, an emergency is declared and this ordinance is effective upon its passage by the Council.

The foregoing ordinance was enacted by the City Council of the City of Coos Bay this 16th day of November, 1999.
