ORDINANCE NO. 289

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 124, BY EXEMPTING CERTAIN RESIDENTIAL STREETS FROM WEIGHT RESTRICTIONS

The City of Coos Bay ordains as follows:

Section 1. Exemption of Certain Residential Streets from Weight Restrictions. Section 1(a) is hereby renumbered to include paragraphs (1) and (2), and the following paragraph (2) is added to Section 1, Subsection 1(a):

(2) Notwithstanding Paragraph (1) of this subsection and except as may be otherwise prohibited by law or ordinance, arterial streets, as designated by the City of Coos Bay Comprehensive Plan Inventory, may be used for the operation of vehicles and for the moving of buildings, structures, articles or materials having a net or gross weight greater than 15,000 pounds. Arterial streets are:

US 240 (Cape Arago Highway–Newmark, Broadway and Virginia US 243 (Ocean Boulevard–Central, Commercial / Anderson) US 101 (Oregon Coast Highway–Bayshore Drive and Broadway) Lakeshore Drive Newmark Avenue Woodland Drive and Broadway (North Bend) 10th Street Koosbay Boulevard Thompson Road 4th Street

Section 2. Severability. The sections and subsections of this ordinance are severable. The invalidity of any one section or subsection shall not affect the validity of the remaining sections or subsections.

The foregoing ordinance was enacted by the City Council of the City of Coos Bay this 7th day of March, 2000.
