MINUTES OF THE PROCEEDINGS OF THE CITY OF COOS BAY URBAN RENEWAL AGENCY

April 17, 2012

The minutes of the proceedings of the City of Coos Bay Urban Renewal Agency, held immediately following the City Council meeting held at 7 p.m. in the Library Meeting Room, 525 Anderson Avenue, Coos Bay, Coos County, Oregon.

Those Attending

Those present were Chair Gene Melton and Board Members Jennifer Groth, Jon Hanson, Stephanie Kramer, Crystal Shoji, John Muenchrath, and Mike Vaughan. City staff present were City Manager Rodger Craddock, City Attorney Nate McClintock, Finance Director Susanne Baker, Deputy Finance Director Amy Kinnaman, Public Works and Development Director Jim Hossley, Economic Revitalization Administrator Joyce Jansen, Library Director Samantha Pierson, Fire Chief Stan Gibson, and Police Chief Gary McCullough.

Public Comments

No comments were given.

Consent Calendar

Chair Melton reviewed the consent calendar which consisted of 2a: approval of the minutes of March 6 and 20, and April 9, 2012; and 2b: acceptance of the March 2012 URA combined cash report. Board Member Shoji moved to approve the consent calendar approving the minutes of March 6 and 20, and April 9, 2012, and accepting the March 2012 URA combined cash report. Board Member Muenchrath seconded the motion which passed with Chair Melton and Board Members Groth, Hanson, Kramer, Shoji, Muenchrath, and Vaughan voting aye.

Review of the Façade Improvement Program

Economic Revitalization Administrator Joyce Jansen stated the Agency implemented the current façade improvement program in November 2006. Funding for the grant program was approved with \$100,000 for the Downtown district and \$50,000 for the Empire district. The purpose of the Façade Improvement Program was to provide financial assistance to property owners and tenants of commercial properties to promote the revitalization of Coos Bay's Urban Renewal Districts. Ms. Jansen provided a brief overview of the Façade Improvement Program requirements which included the application process, a 50/50 grant match, eligibility, architectural guidelines, and the approval process. Ms. Jansen advised over the past several months a number of changes to the program were suggested which included: changing the projects eligible for funding, a rating or point system to determine funding levels, setting a level at which an architect for the project would be required, and changing or increasing the grant amount for business owners not owning the building their business was located. The estimated value of façade project's for the Downtown district was \$828,971 with total awarded grants at \$363,786; and Empire district estimated value of façade projects at \$282,283 with total awarded grants at \$130,081. Ms. Jansen provided a summary of other cities façade grant program and suggested coordinating a work session for further consideration of program changes.

Board Member Groth inquired what the program challenges were whereby Ms. Jansen

recommended businesses making substantial changes to their façade should be required to hire an architect. Chair Melton inquired about the Dolphin Theatre project. Ms. Jansen advised the Dolphin Theatre was not a façade grant but noted the Agency was assisting to fund the construction of an ADA bathroom. Board Member Shoji was in favor of a work session. Board Member Muenchrath expressed his support for the current façade program but was in favor of a work session to review. Board Member Vaughan suggested including representatives from the Main Street Program in the work session. Board Member Groth suggested future consideration should be given to providing assistance with elevator grants and shoring up/stabilizing buildings. Board Member Hanson suggested Ms. Jansen provide a list of pros and cons of past projects. It was the consensus of the Agency to schedule a work session for review and discussion of possible changes.

Investment Reports

BACKGROUND:

These reports are being provided to the Urban Renewal Agency and the public pursuant to a recommendation from the City's Auditor and City Manager to provide transparency and full disclosure to all interested parties. Routinely, the Urban Renewal transactions are included in three of the City's five bank statements (Accounts Payable, Local Government Investment Pool, and Umpqua Bank State Pool) and are balanced by the middle of the following month; expenditures and receipts are updated daily; deposits made daily; and the financial reports available upon request as well as uploaded monthly onto the Citywide drive.

ATTACHED REPORTS:

The **Fund Summary** shows all Urban Renewal funds are within appropriation levels for April with 83% of the fiscal year having elapsed. Urban Renewal Downtown Property Tax Collections are at 94.6% of budget and Urban Renewal Empire Property Tax Collections are at 99.3% of budget.

The **Balance Sheet** shows the <u>Beginning Balance</u> (Fund Balance 7/1/11); (<u>Used or Earned</u>) or the difference between what has been earned to what has been spent (7/1/2011 through 04/30/2012); and the Ending Balance or what amount remains as Fund Balance on 04/30/2012.

ISSUE:

The purpose of the project is to increase pedestrian and bicyclist safety through the widening and overlay of South Empire Blvd from Newmark Avenue to Fulton Avenue; the installation of bicycle lanes, sidewalks, and lighting on both sides of the street; the installation of some view points; the construction of a covered shelter/CCAT bus stop; and the creation of some on-street parking along Empire Boulevard.

BACKGROUND:

The Urban Renewal Agency of the City of Coos Bay applied for and was awarded an Oregon Transportation Commission Flexible Funds Program grant in the amount of \$2.1 million for Phase 1 of the Empire Pedestrian and Bicycle Access Project with the Agency's grant match of \$600,000 for a total project of \$2.7 million commencing in the FYE 11-12 budget.

ADVANTAGES:

This project provides for public safety improvements along with upgrade to the City's transportation infrastructure.

DISADVANTAGES:

None

BUDGET IMPLICATIONS:

The project match grant of \$600,000 will come from the Empire Urban Renewal District Fund.

ACTION REQUESTED:

Staff recommends that council authorize the City Manager to enter into an Intergovernmental Agreement with Oregon Department of Transportation in order to administer the above improvements to Empire Boulevard.

ISSUE:

The Urban Renewal Agency of the City of Coos Bay applied for and was awarded a \$20,000 grant from the Oregon State Marine Board and \$145,000 grant from the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife together totaling \$165,000 for capital improvements to the Eastside Boat Ramp. The City's match is in-kind services along with Urban Renewal Agency's grant match for rental equipment and cash totaling \$60,000 for a total project cost of \$225,000 commencing in the FYE 11-12 budget.

BACKGROUND:

Improvements to the facility include: an additional 23 parking spaces for vehicle / boat trailers and an additional 22 vehicle parking spaces, a fish cleaning station. In addition to the expansion, the City intends to crack seal, seal coat, stripe, and sign the existing parking lot accordingly.

ADVANTAGES:

Address public safety issues, and improve facility value.

DISADVANTAGES:

None

BUDGET IMPLICATIONS:

The total project match is \$60,000. The City's total commitment will include in-kind match from City labor and equipment with the remainder of the match coming from the Downtown Urban Renewal fund for rental equipment and other project costs.

ACTION REQUESTED:

Staff recommends that council authorize City Manager to enter into an agreement with Oregon State Marine Board to administer the above improvements to the Eastside Boat Ramp Facility.

WHEREAS, the Urban Renewal Agency of the City of Coos Bay has complied with the provisions of ORS 294.473 where the new appropriation differs by more than ten percent of the individual fund by providing notice that the governing body shall hold a public hearing on the supplemental budget; the notice was published not less than five days before the meeting and included a summary of the proposed changes in the fund; and the resolution states the need for, the purpose, and amount of the appropriation; and

WHEREAS, the Urban Renewal Agency of the City of Coos Bay applied for and was awarded Oregon State Marine Board, \$20,000, and Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife, \$145,000, grants totaling \$165,000 for capital improvements to the Eastside Boat Ramp with the Agency's grant match of \$60,000 for a total project of \$225,000 commencing in the FYE 11-12 budget; and

WHEREAS, the purpose of the project is to increase car and boat trailer parking spaces; and provide a fish cleaning station to address the increased use of the Eastside Boat Ramp by providing improved and additional facilities, new appropriations are made as set forth:
