ISSUE: Downtown Way-finding/Information Kiosk Signs

BACKGROUND:

At the May 21, 2013 Urban Renewal meeting, members of the Coos Bay Downtown Association (DTA) presented their proposal for three way-finding signs downtown. The DTA will contribute \$10,000 and the Urban Renewal Agency agreed to up to \$14,000 towards the signage project. The Urban Renewal Agency also requested more information regarding way-finding signs; proposed site location, design detail and content of the map. City staff and the Downtown Association propose a City wide Way-Finding system, which breaks out into five (5) zones. The main Way-finding sign would be placed at the Visitor Information Center which includes a map of City of Coos Bay. The map will outline the five (5) zones. Each zone will have a blow up map of that area, which will indicate what each zone consist of in the map legend; entertainment, public facilities, and businesses. The other two signs are kiosk signs, which they list specific information of the downtown area and will be placed accordingly. (See attached map)

ADVANTAGES:

Support and promote a distinct identity for Coos Bay; Raise community and visitor awareness of Coos Bay, and its location; Direct visitors to all areas of Coos Bay from major transportation arteries (Hwy 101); Enhance visitors' and residents' ability to easily navigate the City and find desired destinations, including parking; Increase the success and market potential for retail, dining, arts, entertainment, parks, public facilities, hospital and economic growth and redevelopment in Coos Bay; Support the City's commitment to economic growth and redevelopment.

BUDGET IMPLICATIONS:


The cost to design, construct and install (1) Way-finding signs and (2) Downtown Kiosk signs is \$24,000.00. The Agency has agreed to fund the downtown kiosk signs; \$14,000.00 and the Downtown Association agreed to fund the Visitor information Way-finding sign; \$10,000.00.

If it pleases the Agency, staff request approval of the Way-finding sign design, and authorize staff to move forward with the purchase of the new Way-finding signs.




