Public Comments

No comments were given.

Consent Calendar

Chair Melton reviewed the consent calendar which consisted of 2a: approval of the minutes of June 18, 2013. Board Member Groth moved to approve the consent calendar approving the minutes of June 18, 2013. Board Member Daily seconded the motion which passed with Chair Melton and Board Members Daily, Groth, Kramer, Muenchrath, Shoji, and Vaughan voting aye.

Consideration on Ocean Seafood's Proposal for the Hollering Place

City Manager Rodger Craddock stated Mike Babcock, founder and owner of Oregon Seafoods, LLC presented a proposal to the Agency at the June 18th meeting to construct a new facility for his business on the Hollering Place property in the Empire area of the City. Mr. Craddock advised the Hollering Place Master Plan was a community based visioning process and encouraged members of the community to provide comments on the proposed use of the Hollering Place property. Chair Melton opened the floor to take public input. Steve Skinner, Coos Bay: expressed his support of developing the Hollering Place; noted concerns included odor from processing seafood, the size and layout of the proposed site; suggested potential funding possibilities available through the USDA and Business Oregon. Chris Claflin of Oregon Business and Development stated he believed Mr. Babcock was looking to develop the space to include manufacturing, retail, and social space. No other public comments were given whereby Chair Melton closed the public comment period. Board Member Vaughan expressed concern about the required criteria for the design process; suggested the property should be developed incorporating a multiple use/purpose. Board Member Shoji suggested the proposal should include a requirement for a marketing plan to help the project to succeed. Board Member Daily requested staff look into the zoning to include opportunities for other business development in the area. It was the consensus of the Agency to direct staff to identify criteria for development and to conduct a Request for Proposal (RFP) to allow Mr. Babcock and other interested parties an opportunity to formally present their proposals for the Agency's consideration.
