ISSUE: Acceptance of Emergency Grant to Repair Crab/Fishing Pier

BACKGROUND:

On October 25, 2014 Coos County experienced the first storm of the season, which generated high winds and extreme wave conditions that damaged the Crab/Fishing pier located near the Empire Recreational Boat Launch Facility. The storm caused the brackets on the pile beneath the deck to break off resulting in the deck collapsed. City staff applied for emergency grant through the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife (ODFW) in the amount of \$5,000, which is the maximum amount allowed under the emergency grant program. Total cost to repair Crab/Fishing pier is \$21,350.00, thus the City will be responsible for \$16,350.00.

BUDGET IMPLICATIONS:

The \$16,350.00 will come from Empire Capital Projects Fund, Urban Renewal Projects budget line.

ADVANTAGES:

Reopen the Crab/Fishing pier for safe access.

DISADVANTAGES:

If repairs are not made to the crab/fishing pier, it will remain closed to the public.

RELATED CITY GOAL:

To maintain and improve the City's physical infrastructure and to provide quality services for current and future citizens

ACTION REQUESTED:

If it pleases the Agency Board, accept the grant award from ODFW in the amount of \$5,000.00
