# Approval to Submit a Letter Of Intent to Oregon Main Street to Participate in the Exploring Downtown Program

Joyce Jansen, Assistant City Manager, introduced Gary Van Huffel, Oregon Main Street Coordinator for the Oregon Economic and Community Development Department. Mr. Van Huffel gave an overview of the Oregon Main Street program which includes their four point approach to downtown commercial district revitalization, the level of assistance for the specific needs of the community, the benefits of the Oregon Main Street approach and the direct benefits to the local government. Board Member McKeown moved to authorize staff to write a Letter of Intent to participate at the Exploring Downtown level to be submitted to Oregon Main Street Program. Board Member Daily seconded the motion which passed with Chair Eck and Board Members Burnette, Daily, Kramer, McKeown, and Melton voting ave.

#### **Discussion on the Pedway Plaza**

Board Member McKeown stated that he would like to move forward with developing a plan for the Pedway and suggested to direct staff to take a look at this project and get some professional design consultants involved. Board Member McKeown said that he would like to see the Steve Prefontain Memorial moved to the Pedway. Board Member Kramer thought moving the memorial was a good idea. It was the consensus of the Board Members to direct staff to move forward with a plan for the Pedway.
